If your child is absent one day every two weeks over the course of a school year this will add up to 20 days loss of education. This is almost half a school term.

Religious Education 2017 Action Plan

All schools in the Parramatta Diocese are required to have Action Plans in the areas of Literacy, Numeracy and Religious Education. These plans are meant to be short, precise and "dynamically lived" documents (updated at the end of each term), which articulates the school's strategic work in the areas of Formation and Literacy and Numeracy. The School Action Plans are informed by school data with SMART Learning Goals (Specific, Measurable, Attainable, Realistic and Time-targeted), for improving student learning outcomes.

School Action Plans form the basis for the professional learning of teachers so that the learning of the students can improve.

This year the Religious Education goal is: For all students to improve their understanding of Scripture and its application to their lives.

This goal will be achieved by using teaching strategies that will encourage all students to develop a deeper understanding of the meaning of scripture and its application to their lives. Though making deep connections between scripture, God/Jesus, Sacraments and Christian behaviours students will gain a better understanding of Catholic traditions and practices.

Class Prayer Bags

Class prayer bags have now been distributed to classes. This year the Prayer Bags will come home on a more regular basis (every third night) to allow each family to receive the Prayer Bag more than once a year.

Prayer is an important part of the life of a Catholic school and the Prayer Bags offer a link between home and school through prayer. We hope that when your child brings home this bag for the that you will gather together as a family, and use the contents of the prayer bag to pray together. We also invite you, as a family, with your child to write a prayer in the prayer journal.



The prayer written by your child will become part of the class prayer during the week or on Friday afternoon.

The Prayer Bag is a very special and sacred bag. We know that you, with your child will take care of it and see that it is *completely and safely returned to school* to ensure every child is given the same prayerful opportunity. Thank you for joining with the St Mary MacKillop Community in prayer.

Ash Wednesday

Wednesday 1st of March is Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent. The Season of Lent is the 40 days prior to Easter (Sundays are not included in the count) and is a time of preparation for the resurrection of Jesus Christ on Easter Sunday.



Ash Wednesday is the day for us to take stock of our spiritual lives and we are encouraged to attend Mass on this day in order to mark the beginning of the Lenten season. As Lent begins, we should set out specific spiritual goals we would like to reach before Easter and decide how we will pursue them—for instance receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

To celebrate the beginning of Lent there will be an Ash Wednesday Liturgy, led by Year 3, at 9:15am on the 1st March in the hall. All parents and family members are warmly invited to attend this special prayer time.

During the liturgy the ashes, which give Ash Wednesday its name, will be distributed. The ashes are made from the blessed palms used in the Palm Sunday celebration of the previous year. While the ashes symbolize penance and contrition, they are also a reminder that God is gracious and merciful to those who call on Him with repentant hearts.

The distribution of ashes, is a tangible reminder of our own need to focus on being better people. Through acts of penance comes a change of heart – a coming back to God. Our personal Lenten journey should be marked with reflection, prayer and penance. Throughout Lent we should strive to model the actions of Christ. As the prophet Joel wrote:

***'Now, now – it is the Lord who speaks –
come back to me with all your heart.'***

'ZERO TOLERANCE' OF ILLEGAL PARKING IN SCHOOL ZONES TO PROTECT YOUR CHILD

When it comes to the safety of vulnerable road users like school children, drivers found breaking the law will be met with zero tolerance. Children are small, harder to see, behave unpredictably and are extremely vulnerable. They need you to take extra care when driving and parking around school zones.

FACT/S

If you've heard the expression "It's only a matter of time until someone gets hurt" then you understand why it is important for everyone to obey the road rules.

A child hit at an impact speed of 30km/hr has a 99% chance of surviving. At 70km/hr the chance of survival is less than 7%.

What does this mean?

You cannot stop in this area for any reason.

Why is it there?

To keep sight distance clear for drivers, children & other pedestrians to avoid crashes.



What does this mean?

You cannot stop or park in a bus zone unless you are driving a bus.

Why is it there?

To provide a safe place for buses to set down & pick up passengers



What does this mean?

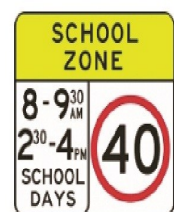
You can stop in this area to drop off or pick up passengers for a maximum of 2 minutes. You must stay within 3 metres of your vehicle.

Why is it there?

To provide safe places for children to be picked up - usually associated with Kiss & Ride zones.



40 km/hr School Zones are provided to increase the safety of all pedestrians, but especially children, who are walking in the vicinity of schools. Obey the limit and be aware of the time of day.



Parking on footpaths/nature strips is an offence - fines can be issued that include the loss of 2 demerit points.

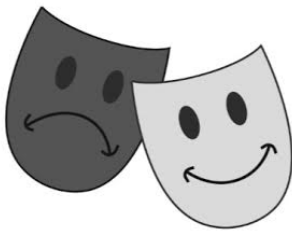
