Crossing Safety

We have received a number of enquiries and concerns recently with regard to our crossing guard being absent before and after school.

This is a complex but highly important issue as it pertains to the safety of our children. The current arrangement at St Mary MacKillop is that our crossing supervisors are employed by NSW Transport – Roads and Maritime Services. As such they are managed by and responsible to that organisation. The crossing supervisor is not an employee of the school or of Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta. As such, the crossing supervisor is not required to report to me if they will be unable to complete their role on any given day. They report to Roads and Maritime Services, who attempt to engage a casual replacement supervisor as a solution. The Roads and Maritime Services will notify the school of absences of crossing supervisors if they cannot find a replacement but this often is received at 9:30am – after the school day has commenced. There are very strict limits on what myself or my staff are able to do in the absence of a crossing supervisor e.g. we are not authorised to use the 'crossing lollipop'. I am continuing to discuss this matter, on your behalf, with Roads and Maritime Services.

Our current crossing supervisor, Tony, is a very dedicated and committed supporter of our children's safety and does not take absences lightly. However there are times when he will not able to be at our school.

Could I ask that as parents who drive their children to school, that you check whether a crossing supervisor is present each morning. If a supervisor is not on duty, please walk your child across the Fragar Road crossing. This will ensure that they safely arrive at school. In the afternoons our caring staff already escort the children across Fragar Road for dismissal and this process will continue.

Thank you for working in partnership with us to ensure safety for all of our children.

Each sport has a different registration criteria.

This online form is an EXPRESSION OF INTEREST for the 2018 Parramatta Diocesan Primary Sport Team trials. You may complete this form to attend a selection trial or if you have been selected in a representative squad or team. One form is to be completed per child, per individual sport and when completed, click SUBMIT.

Please note that your online registration is an **EXPRESSION OF INTEREST ONLY** and MUST be approved by your child's school. In order for your child to attend the nominated trial or event this may come down to the discretion of your school as to who is selected to attend the trial. In some sports only 2 students per school can be nominated. Please complete all fields and especially "Representative Experience".

Your child's school will notify you one week prior to the trial date if your child is to attend to the Parramatta Diocesan trial for their selected sport by providing a trial information sheet.

Under no circumstances will a child be eligible to trial if the Online Registration Form has not been completed and approved by the school by the closing date.

\$8.00 trialling fee is payable on the day for after school trials & \$10.00 trialling fee is payable on the day for half day and full day trials.

- This is to be paid upon registration at the trials once your child has been approved to attend the Parramatta Diocesan Trials.

Please note that the full day trials will be for boys cricket, boys soccer, boys rugby league & boys rugby union.

Due to the popularity of boys cricket, boys soccer and girls netball a maximum of 2 children only are eligible to trial from each school. Selection of the 2 boys and girls will be made jointly by the school sport coordinator and principal.

Half day trial for tennis and netball... all other trials will be held after school beginning at 4pm.

MACKILL OP TRIAL

It should be noted that the main purpose of the Mackillop trial is to select a team to compete at the NSW PSSA Championships. The Inter-Diocesan MacKillop Trial is not a competition although a round robin format is often used to facilitate the selection procedure.

NSW PSSA CHAMPIONSHIPS

Children who are successful at being selected in the Mackillop team will compete at the N.S.W. P.S.S.A. Championships. These championships involve three or four days of competition at various locations in NSW. Children selected in these teams may also be required to attend training sessions. At the NSW PSSA Championships a State team will be selected to participate at the School Sport Australia Inter State Exchange for some sports.

SCHOOL SPORT AUSTRALIA

To be considered for selction in the NSWPSSA state team for participation at all School Sport Australia 12 Years & Under championships: Students mus be turning between the ages of 10 and 12 in the year of competition i.e. Students turning the ages of 8, 9 and 13 in the year of competition are not eligible for NSWPSSA State selection.

Please note the following information:

- Parents are responsible for all transport and supervision arrangements and must remain to supervise their child at the trial at all times.
- Children need to generally be of representative standard.
- Attendance at training days, where applicable is compulsory.
- The selector's decisions are final.
- Parents will need to make their own travel arrangements for children representing Parramatta at Inter-Diocesan MacKillop trials. This
 may mean travel to Sydney, Wollongong, Canberra, Wagga or Forbes.
- Please be aware that the teacher conducting the trial and accompanying the team to the venue is a "Team Manager" ~ not a coach.

A Message from Busways

School Opal Card - Help Us to Help You!

This message has been sent from Busways, the bus operator that provides your school bus services,

regarding student use of the School Opal card.

An important requirement of School Opal card is the need for students to Tap On and Tap Off when they travel to and from school.

Opal data gathered by tapping on and off is used to determine demand for bus services. If students don't tap on and tap off, services may be cancelled due to the lack of recorded patronage.

With this in mind, we ask for your assistance in reminding your students that tapping on and off at the beginning and end of each trip is one of the conditions of using a School Opal card. This in turn helps us ensure we are able to provide the appropriate level of service to your students.

To further promote the use of School Opal, Busways will also be conducting checks on School Opal cards over the coming months. All students travelling on buses to and from school will be required to show their card and ensure they Tap On and Tap Off every time they catch the bus. Students without an Opal Card will be provided with a brochure to take home identifying how they can get an Opal Card.

MORE PUBLIC TRANSPORT SERVICES COMING SOON TO A STOP, WHARF AND STATION NEAR YOU

Public transport customers will benefit from 8,600 extra weekly services from 26 November when a new timetable is introduced.

This includes more than 1,500 new train services, almost 7000 new bus services, the introduction of 2000 new B-Line services for the Northern Beaches, and more than 140 ferry services.

If you use public transport now you will notice plenty of information and announcements at stations, ferry wharves and on buses across the public transport network.

Not all services will change but adjustments will be made across the public transport network to better align services, making it even easier to change between different modes of public transport.

How the timetable changes may affect you:

your train line or platform may change at different times of the day or week

your train, bus and ferry times may have changed

you may now need to interchange to complete your journey

there could now be an express service or faster trip to get you where you need to go

Staff will be available at stations across the network to assist customers through these changes. Customers with special needs should seek out staff assistance, especially at busy stations like Central, Town Hall and Parramatta.

Over the coming weeks take some time to find out more about the changes so you can be prepared on Sunday 26 November. Visit transportnsw.info to access the new timetable and start planning future journeys. A new interactive mapping tool will help you to understand how your trip might change so you can prepare in advance.
