Mary Help of Christians – Friday 24th May
Thursday the 24th of May is the Solemnity of Mary Help of Christians –the Patron Saint of Australia.

Mary Help of Christians was adopted as patron of the infant Church of Australia in 1844 at a significant time in our history. British settlement was just over fifty years old, the transportation of convicts was coming to an end, and the first elec-

tions in Australian history had been held in 1843. Issues of land, immigration and education had begun to surface and the Church was involved in these social problems.

No priests were sent to the colony in its early days and Mass was not allowed, except for one brief year, until 1820. It was largely the Rosary in those early days that kept the faith alive.


Catholic Australia remained faithful to Mary and was the first nation to choose her under the title Help of Christians, as principal Patroness. The Irish pioneer priest, Fr John Therry, dedicated St Mary's Cathedral to Mary. He arrived in Sydney in 1820 and assumed responsibility for the planning and initial construction of the Cathedral.


When Australia became the first country to have Mary Help of Christians as Patroness, it became the first country to have a mother-cathedral under the same title.

On the Solemnity of Mary Help of Christians we pray the following prayer:

Almighty God, Deepen in our hearts our love of Mary Help of Christians. Through her prayers and under her protection, may the light of Christ shine over our land. May Australia be granted harmony, justice and peace. Grant wisdom to our leaders and integrity to our citizens. Bless especially the men and women of the Australian Defence Force and their families. We ask this through Christ Our Lord. Amen. Mary Help of Christians, pray for us.

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Peer Support 2019

In week 1 of this term we commenced our Peer Support program with classroom teachers introducing our topic on "Relationships" while our year 6 leaders were busy preparing and training for their leadership role. The whole school participates in Peer Support lessons for 30 minutes each week. The year 6 leaders facilitate a small group of 10-12 younger students, who work together through a number of structured activities. Each teacher will supervise 2-3 groups in their classroom. We are working on a module called Keeping Friends helping us explore the concept of friendship, build relationships and develop skills in empathy and critical thinking. The module runs for 8 sessions. We encourage you to talk to your children about Peer Support every week as it will help to reinforce the concepts learned in each session.

During the last two sessions we discussed the qualities of friends and how important it is to cooperate and listen to each other and the different kinds of friends we have.

Week 4

This week in the Peer Support session, children will be focusing on the importance of support networks and the role that friends play in each others lives. Children will construct a visual representation of this during the session. Encourage your child to identify friends they have who can provide support to them if the need arises.

Week 5

During Peer Support this week the children will be looking at how to play in a friendly way in order to maintain friends and build positive relationships. Through various activities children will discover the importance of taking turns and having consistent rules throughout a game. This week help your child practice these skills by encouraging them to play games with siblings, family or friends.

THE SPLIT STRATEGY

Numbers are split into tens and ones. For example, 46 becomes four tens (40) and six ones (6),

and 33 is three tens (30) and three ones (3).

Addition

Splitting the tens and only one group of ones:

$$33 + 35 =$$

$$33 + 30 = 63 + 5 = 68$$

Therefore 33 + 35 = 68

Splitting the tens from the ones:

$$46 + 33$$

$$= (40+6)+(30+3)$$

$$=40+30+6+3$$

$$= 70 + 9$$

$$= 79$$

This makes it easier to add the tens and the ones (40 + 30 + 6 + 3)

Subtraction

$$63 - 35 =$$

$$63 - 30 = 33 - 5 = 28$$

Or

$$67 - 43 =$$


$$67 - 7 = 60$$
 and $43 - 3 = 40$


$$60 - 40 = 20$$
 and $7 - 3 = 4$

$$20 + 4 = 24$$

Therefore 63 - 35 = 24
